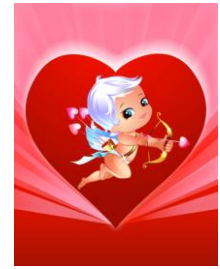

Academically Speaking

This week students will continue with the novel Milkweed. We will complete our small group picture book reading comprehension lesson presentations. Students will begin a writing assignments/webquest on understanding the historical accuracy of the novel.

In Social Studies we will continue work on understanding constitutional rights and the process involved in writing the US constitution. Students will be making soap with Mrs. Krehel later this week.

In Science we will continue work on our Atomic theory chapter focusing on the subatomic particles that make up an atom. Specifically we will focus on a basic understanding of electron configuration and how electrons release photons when the change energy levels. There is a Science test on Thursday of this week. **Reminder: Students should be working on their Science Fair Projects. Booklets were sent home in December and are available on the website.**

Students will be working in math groups this week. Parent support of homework is appreciated.
