Friday, November 2nd is the end of the first marking period. Wow, how time flies! Report cards will be sent home on Friday, November 9th.



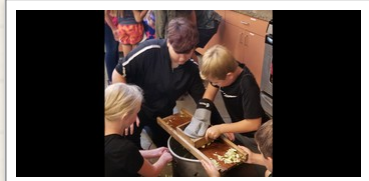
## CHATFIELD FAMILY GEOGRAPHY NIGHT

## PIE MEETING NOVEMBER

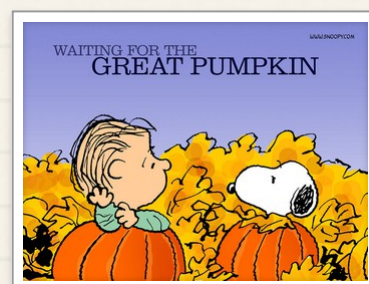
The November PIE meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, Nov. 13 at 3:45pm. We hope you can join us.
