Academically Speaking

In English, Students are finishing their first set of small group novels and are beginning their first book report assignment.

In Social Studies, students will be completing a web quest on the History of Halloween. We will also begin our focus on the Revolutionary war.

In Science, students will be continuing their Chemistry unit. This week we will be experimenting all week with the Science of Halloween. This will include the science of the glow stick (Chemiluminescence), dry ice investigations (Sublimation) and Atomic slime (Polymers).

Students should also have with them a silent reading book from home or from the library. We do not build this into a set time of the day however; we encourage them to find 15-20 minutes throughout the day and again at home to focus on independent reading.
