Welcome Back!

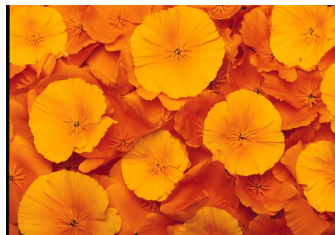
Welcome to 7th grade!
